

And yet, just 54% of the global population use it.




Climate Action

In April, daily global emissions were down 17% compared to 2019. By June, they were only 5% lower, even though normal activity had not yet resumed. Emissions are expected to return to even higher levels after the pandemic. This year's global lockdowns may result in a 6% drop in gas emissions for 2020, however this drop is still short of the 7.6% reduction for the year required to limit global warming to 1.5C by 2030.

Economic fallout from the pandemic has the potential to push an additional 71 million people into extreme poverty. This would be the first time that poverty has increased globally in 30 years.

As of February 2020, only 87 countries had unemployment protection programmes anchored in national legislation, and only 34 of these countries covered the self-employed

School closures kept 90% of children out of school this year and an estimated 379 million children missed out on school meals because of school closures during the pandemic.

Women account for 70% of health and social workers. Yet in pandemic related leadership roles, they make up 25% in national parliaments and 35% in local governments.

Using their satellite data, the National Institute of Space Research, found that 64% more land was cleared in the Amazon in April this year compared to the same month in 2019.
